# Postgraduate taught degrees (Masters)

Most taught postgraduate degrees in the UK are completed in one year, without a summer vacation. At Sussex, our postgraduate taught courses normally begin in October and teaching will finish by June. You then carry out work on your independent research (dissertation) over the summer period.

The academic entry requirements refer to a typical UK offer. You can find more detailed information on our website. Entry requirements are sometimes flexible, so please enquire if your results are not quite high enough.
