We are proud to continue developing our range of modern teaching resources and facilities.

Our latest modern teaching and learning facility will open at the Ealing site this year.

The Leadership and Management Development Suite will include a 75-seat lecture theatre, library, fully-equipped conference room and a performance area. Local businesses as well as our students will be able to use and enjoy this brand new centre of learning and development.

From research into healthcare to support for the legal profession, we have a number of outstanding research facilities here on the campus.

Our state-of-the-art simulation centre at our Brentford site plays a pivotal role in training nursing and healthcare professionals of the future. Since opening in 2007, volunteers have helped support our healthcare students by taking on the role of the patient and giving students detailed feedback from the patient's point of view.

The Richard Wells Research Centre was established in 1995 to develop research and education initiatives in the field of caring for patients with HIV. The Centre now also tackles prevention and care issues associated with infectious diseases and infections. This is the only research centre of its type in the Higher education sector. The Centre works closely with a number of other leaders in its field, including the Department of Health.

Our Professional Development Centre for Law was set up in 2010 to support the legal profession at a time of rapid change in the legal and regulatory environment. The Centre holds seminars throughout the year both on campus and on site with local employers.

Our energy strategy sets out our commitment to reduce energy consumption, use renewable and natural energy sources and reduce our carbon footprint. We have already reduced gas, water and electricity consumption by 25% and are determined to continue building on this achievement.

We recycle and use locally sourced Fairtrade products as part of our Environmental Sustainability Policy. We are also setting up a green initiative with the Students' Union and Ealing Council to help achieve big improvements in sustainability in our local area.

After measuring and reducing our carbon emissions by 9%, we achieved the Carbon Trust Standard, the world's first independent carbon award. Going forward, we are focusing on meeting our pledge to reduce carbon emissions by 34% by 2020.

From off the shelf to online, our libraries offer all kinds of learning opportunities.

As well as an extensive stock of specialist books and journals, the libraries provide fully-networked, open access work stations, scanners, colour printers, DVD, CD, video and audio playback facilities, full internet and subject-specific databases, all housed in a combination of open and personal study areas.

There are libraries on each of our sites, some specialising in particular subject areas. Each library is staffed with resource assistants who can help you make the most of the resources available. We also have subject specialist librarians who can help with more detailed queries. Librarians also provide information skills training online or in person to help you find, evaluate and use information more effectively throughout your course.
