INTERNATIONAL APPLICATION FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION: Application Requirements & Instructions

Who should use the "International Application for Undergraduate Admission" form?

You should use this form if you are:

- a citizen of a country other than Canada who is studying in Canada or outside of Canada.
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada who is currently studying/residing outside Canada.

Citizenship determines which tuition fees you will be required to pay. If you are:

- a citizen of a country other than Canada (and not a permanent resident of Canada), you will pay international tuition fees.
- a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada, you will pay Canadian tuition fees.

UNDERGRADUATE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Academic Documents Requirements:
 - a) For students enrolled in their final year of high school: An official transcript, which lists all subjects completed in high school as well as subjects in progress including mid-term grades. Transcripts must show grading scale. A school profile is much appreciated. For students enrolled in the I.B. Diploma or Certificate or Advanced level/Advanced Subsidiary and Advanced Placement courses, predicted grades are required.
 - b) For students who have completed high school: An official final transcript, which lists all subjects completed in high school, plus a notarized copy of high school diploma. School profile is much appreciated. For students who have completed the I.B. Diploma or Advanced level/Advanced Subsidiary and Advanced Placement courses the official, original certificate(s) is required.
 - c) For students who are currently enrolled in a post-secondary institution or who have completed post-secondary schooling: An official, final high school transcript, which includes all subjects completed, plus a notarized copy of high school diploma. For those applicants currently enrolled in a university, the transcript must list courses completed and in progress. In the event that a university is unable to provide a listing of courses in progress, we require an official, signed letter from the Registrar which lists the courses for which you are currently enrolled. Transcripts must show grading scale. For those applicants who have completed post-secondary studies, an official final transcript and a notarized copy of degree certificate/diploma is required.

Should your documents be in a language other than English, an official, notarized, translation is required with the original transcript. We do not accept interpretative translations.

In some cases, we will accept a notarized copy of an official document in the event that only one original was issued (i.e., O, A or AS level certificates). However, in some cases, we may ask for the original document in order to make an admission decision. If this is the case, we will return to you the original document. In all cases, if a notarized copy is provided, and you accept our offer of admission, you must bring the original document with you in order to register. A NOTARIZED COPY is a copy of the original document which has been attested and certified to be a true copy of the original by a notary public or lawyer. Attestations by school officials, government officials, educational consultants, or banks will not be accepted as notarized copies.

TRENT UNIVERSITY ACCEPTS ONLY THE OFFICIAL, ORIGINAL OR NOTARIZED COPIES OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS. PHOTOCOPIES, FAXES OR SCANNED COPIES OF THE ORIGINAL ARE NOT ACCEPTED AS PROOF OF THE ORIGINAL.

TRENT UNIVERSITY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO VERIFY THE LEGITIMACY AND AUTHENTICITY OF RECEIVED DOCUMENTS THROUGH THE APPROPRIATE EXAMINATION BODIES.

All documents submitted become property of Trent University and therefore will not be returned. We recommend, therefore, that should you have only one original document, that you have it notarized, and keep the original for your records.

d) Transfer credit: Courses from another university may be granted transfer credit to a maximum of 10 credits (2 years of study). The university must be accredited in order to be considered for transfer credit. Applicants are required to submit official, detailed course descriptions, which must include the total hours and topics covered. Official translations are required should the course descriptions not be in English. Only courses with grades of 'C' (65%) or higher will be considered for transfer credit. Evaluations are completed by the appropriate departmental chairs at Trent. Please note that there is a non-refundable required fee due at the time of accepting our admission offer. Assessments are conducted after you have been offered admission, accepted our offer and, if applicable, paid the transfer credit assessment fee of \$50CD*.

*Students who have applied for admission to Trent through Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC) or who are in progress of completing or have completed IB Diploma, A level or AP courses do not need to pay this fee. This fee is not credited against tuition.

Our institutional code is 0896. We will only accept the Official Score Report as the official TOEFL score, as forwarded to us by ETS.

Please note that English Language Proficiency requirements are subject to change without prior notice.

Applicants who have not achieved the minimum grade required in English in the Canadian, American School System, GCE or IB program are required to show proof of English proficiency by any of the above noted examinations. An applicant whose primary language is not English, or whose previous education has been conducted in another language, or who has studied for less than three years at an internationally accredited school where English is the primary language of instruction, must show proof of English language proficiency.

Applicants who do not meet the English language proficiency requirement are invited to apply for **gradual admission** through the **TRENT-ESL: English for University** program. For more information, please visit **www.trentu.ca/esl**

3. International Application Fee and Courier Fee:

Students who wish to apply directly to Trent University (except exchange students) are required to pay a CDN\$50.00 (US\$50.00) application fee. Applicants, except those who are applying from within Canada, are also required to pay a one-time courier fee of CDN\$45.00 or US\$45.00. This ensures that applicants receive important university correspondence quickly and assuredly. Please note that our courier company does not recognize P.O. Boxes as deliverable addresses. Therefore, it is necessary to provide a street name and number. The application and courier fee is NON-REFUNDABLE and not credited against tuition. Please do not send cash. Acceptable forms of payment include: international money order or bank drafts (in Canadian funds ONLY, payable to Trent University), cheque (in US or Canadian funds, payable to Trent University), VISA, MasterCard or American Express. Credit cards from Nigeria are not accepted. See application form for details.
