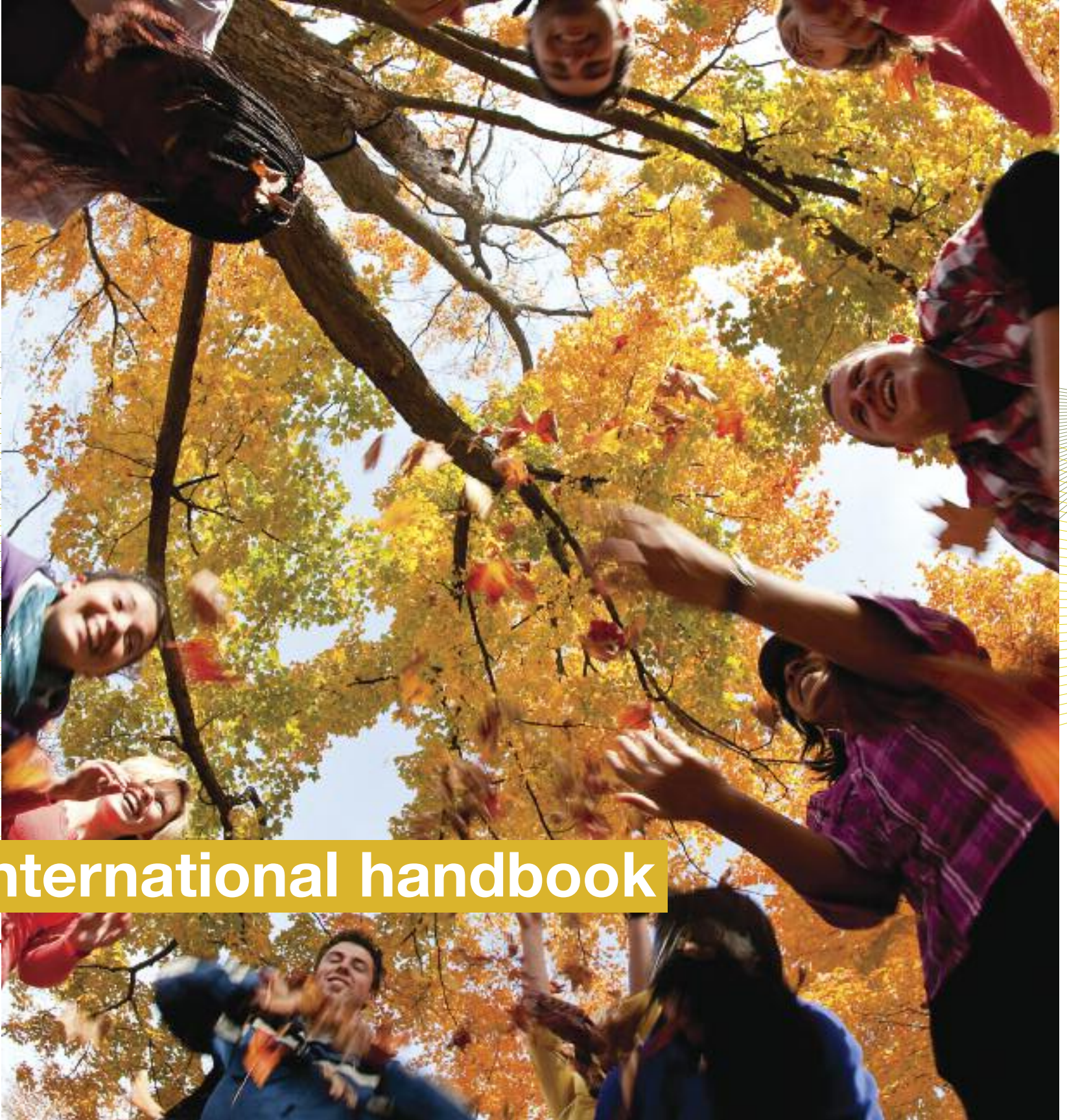

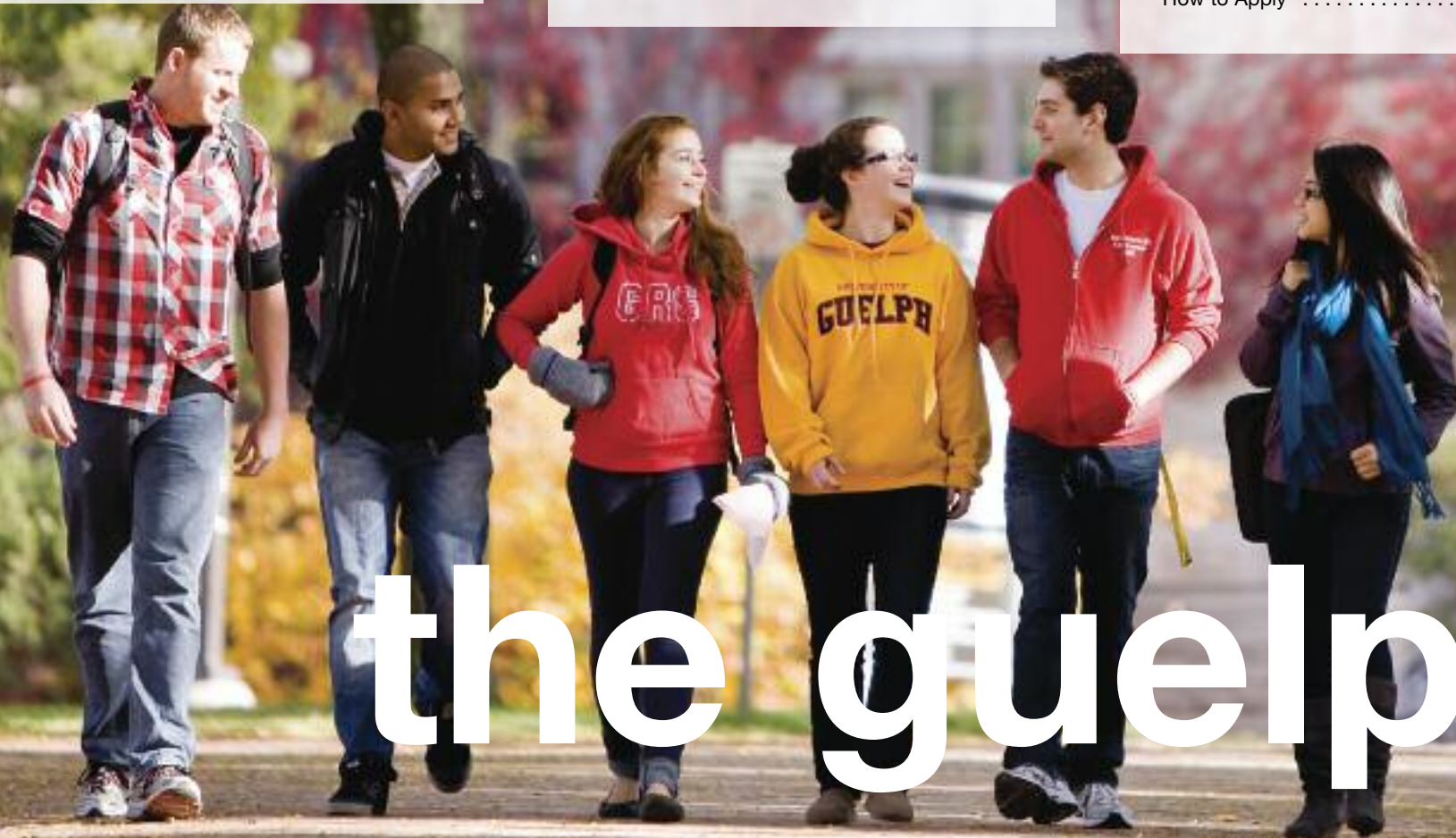

Guelph – Your University

The University of Guelph main campus is located in the south-western Ontario city of Guelph. The city and the university are noted as **great places to live and to learn**. The city of Guelph has a population of 118,000 and is one hour from Toronto, Canada's largest city and airline hub, and less than 2 hours from the Niagara Falls, US border.

In addition to the main campus, the university has three Regional Campuses – Alfred, Kemptville, and Ridgetown and a state-of-the-art facility in Toronto, the **University of Guelph-Humber** offering specialized programs that integrate the university and college experience.

Globally, the University of Guelph is listed within the world's top 300 on the 2010 Academic Ranking of World Universities published by the Shanghai Jiao Tong University, Centre for World Class Universities. The University of Guelph is represented by alumni living in 148 countries and a student body from over 100 nations. Guelph students have the opportunity to live and learn in 30 countries by participating in one of the 56 international exchange programs or semester abroad options which encourage students to explore a truly global experience.

The University of Guelph continually strengthens Canada's global reputation as a leader in innovative research and teaching excellence. We have a dedication to four major pillars: food, health, community and environment. These areas represent the larger goal of our degree programs to accelerate research that will help people around the world. We are focused on blending teaching, research and citizenship. Few institutions are as prepared as the University of Guelph to address the challenges facing the world today.

Annual research funding of over C\$157.9M provides opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students to participate in cutting-edge research, and to attract award-winning faculty to the university.

Worldly Involvement

Engineers Without Borders (EWB)

The University of Guelph Chapter strives to educate and motivate their peers and the community towards EWB's mission to promote human development through access to technology. In the past five years, Guelph students have travelled to placements in Zambia, Malawi, Ghana, Indonesia and the Philippines.

Landscape Architecture in Nicaragua

In May 2010, students from the Bachelor of Landscape Architecture program travelled to Nicaragua where they contributed to a community project alongside Nicaraguan university students and architectural professionals. Consistently ranked as one of the top comprehensive universities in Canada

Comprehensive universities are those that offer a wide range of undergraduate and graduate programs and are fully engaged in research activities. The balance between teaching and research provides students with rich learning experiences inside and outside the classroom.

According to Research Infosource Inc., U of G is one of only 17 universities in Canada with \$100 Million Dollar Club status. Club status is given to universities who attract considerable amounts of research support and income. University of Guelph has the highest graduation rate among Canada's comprehensive universities and an excellent faculty to student ratio of 1:20.

Notable Alumni

Our graduates live, work, and succeed globally, doing important work and making a name for themselves.

Dr. Roberta Bondar, 1968

B.Sc (Agr) Zoology and Agriculture graduate, she went on to become Canada's first female astronaut (1992, Discovery shuttle). She also received the Order of Canada, a NASA Space Medal, 22 honorary degrees, and was an inductee into the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame for her research in neurology.

Cassie Campbell, 1997

Sociology and Nutrition graduate and Gryphon Hockey player from 1992 to 1996 is a six-time world champion, three-time Olympic medallist. She captained the Canadian National women's hockey team to two gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

Dr. Mick Bhatia, 1995

Director and Senior Scientist, McMaster Stem Cell and Cancer Research Institute. A recognized leader in Canada in the field of human hematopoietic stem cell biology, Dr. Bhatia has made several important advancements in human stem cell research.

Founded in 1862, the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) at the University of Guelph is the oldest Veterinary College in North America. The college has an international reputation for research.

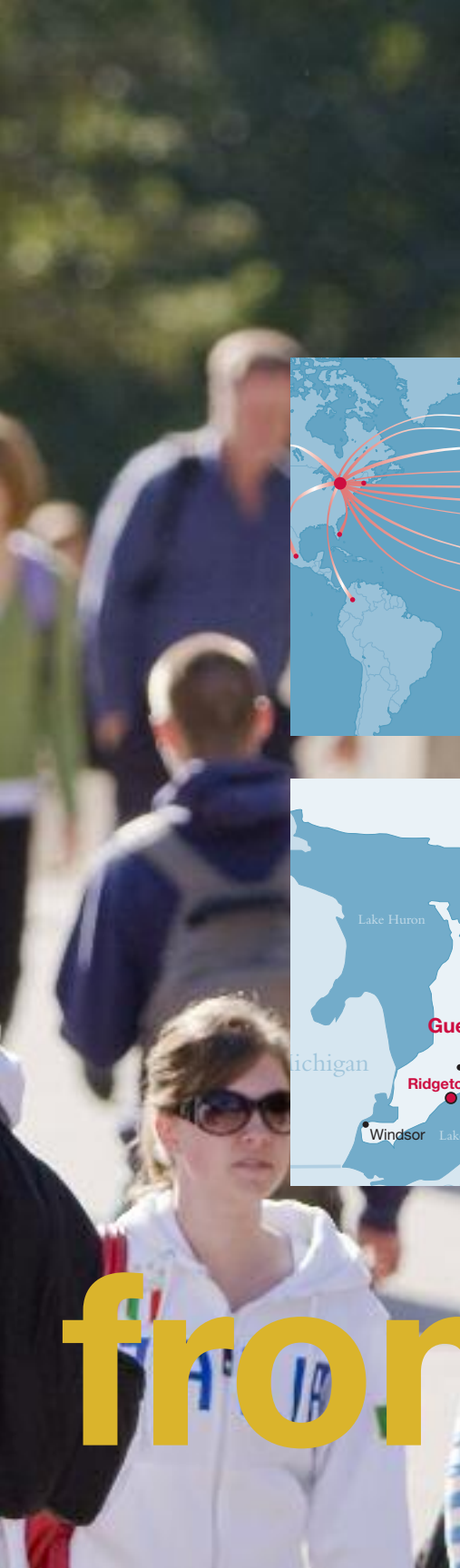

International Admission Requirements

If you are applying to the University of Guelph from another country, the official secondary school graduation certificate used to admit you to an internationally recognized university in your home country is normally acceptable for consideration for admission. Please note that the possession of the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission or preclude your admission counsellor from requesting further documentation or verification procedures.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Applicants who have completed Advanced Placement Examinations with a minimum grade of 4 may receive university credit to a maximum of 2.0 credits, subject to the discretion of the Degree Program Admission Committee. Please arrange for an official school report to be sent directly to Admissions Services at the campus where your program is located. Transfer credit will be assigned once official final transcripts have been received.

American Patterned Education: High School Diploma (USA)

Applicants must have a minimum unweighted grade point average of 3.0 from a regionally accredited high school and a combined math and critical reading SAT score of 1100 (excluding the Writing Test score) or ACT score of 24. Applicants should include among their senior

level courses, specific subjects that are required for admission to their degree program of choice. Particular attention is paid to performance in program prerequisites. Students should ensure that senior year final grades from first semester and second semester interim grades are submitted before the March 1st document deadline date. School profile with grading scale should be included with documents. Guelph's institution code is 0892.

British Patterned Education: General Certificate of Education Requirements (GCE)

- Minimum of two Advanced Level passes and three GCSE or IGCSE (Ordinary Level) passes.
- Two Advanced Supplementary (AS) Level courses may be substituted for one Advanced Level course.

Applicants are expected to present a 'B' grade on GCSE/IGCSE, AS and predicted Advanced level examinations. While consideration will be given to subject prerequisites at the GCSE/IGCSE level, students are encouraged to present requirements at the AS or Advanced level. Please note that general paper is not considered an acceptable subject. Transfer credits will be considered for Advanced level subjects with a final grade of C or better up to a maximum of 3.0 credits (1.0 credit per course). Note: In one

academic year students generally complete 5.0 credits.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

Students applying with an IB diploma should present a minimum score of 28, some programs will require a higher score for admission consideration. Reported bonus points will be taken into consideration.

Applicants should complete the diploma with six subjects: 3 higher level and 3 standard level. Students should also include specific subject requirements for the program to which they are applying among their standard and higher level courses. Please note that Math Studies is not an acceptable prerequisite for programs that require mathematics. Applicants currently completing the IB diploma will be considered for admission based upon predicted IB scores. Transfer credit may be given for higher level courses with grades of 5 or better to a maximum of 2.0 credits. Students should ensure that their predicted scores are submitted using the 7 point scale. Transfer credit will be assigned once official final transcripts have been received in Admission Services.

French Baccalaureat

Students applying with a French Baccalaureat should present a minimum overall score of 12 out of 20. Specific subject prerequisites should be completed at the highest co-efficient level.

Regional campuses at Alfred, Kemptville, and Ridgetown offer distinctive educational programs that combine theory with practical training, preparing graduates for a broad range of careers in the agricultural food, environmental, and equine industries. Associate diploma programs provide courses in veterinary technology applied science, business management, production, and marketing. Programs are offered in English in Guelph, Kemptville and Ridgetown, and in French at Le Campus d'Alfred. Students enrolled in the **Bachelor of Bio-Resource Management (BBRM)** degree program will also study at the regional campuses for the first two years of their programs. Equine Management majors will begin at Kemptville; Environmental Management majors will begin at Ridgetown. All BBRM students will complete their final two years of study at the main campus in Guelph.

Campus d'Alfred

Language of Instruction: French

This campus provides two-year Associate Diploma programs in Agriculture, Horticulture, and Food, Nutrition & Risk Management. It also delivers co-op diploma programs for Agricultural Equipment Technicians and Horticultural Technicians as well as a number of certificates and short courses.

Ridgetown Campus

Ridgetown Campus, established in 1922, provides modern classroom and recreational facilities within a small-town environment. The campus is located in Ridgetown,

Ontario, just east of Chatham and approximately one hour west of London and hosts approximately 500 degree, diploma, and certificate students.

The campus offers Associate Diploma programs in Agriculture, Horticulture, Environmental Management, and Veterinary Technology, as well as certificate programs in Veterinary Medical Office Administration and Landscape Management.
