



Undergraduate Admission Requirements

Mount Allison University recognizes a strong academic performance at the high school level along with leadership skills, extracurricular and community involvement, and the potential for personal growth as good indications of your university potential. In making admissions decisions, both high school marks and other activities are considered. Among the additional information requested from applicants will be evidence of extracurricular involvement, volunteer activities, and work experiences. A letter of intent and/or letters from teachers, guidance counsellors and others may be part of the admissions process.

MINIMUM GENERAL ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

All applications to Mount Allison are assessed individually. Students applying to Mount Allison are expected to graduate from high school at the university-preparatory level. In all Canadian provinces and territories this is Grade 12. Students from Quebec will be expected to have completed either Grade 12 Senior Matriculation or Grade 11 and one year of a CEGEP academic program. All students must successfully complete a university-preparatory English course and generally at least four other university-preparatory courses. For an application to be considered, a minimum grade of 65% must have been achieved on

each university-preparatory course considered for admission. Applicants should note that meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the University and most students admitted exceed the minimum requirement. Applicants are encouraged to take a well-balanced preparatory year. In general, electives from the following categories will count towards admission: math, science, languages, humanities, and social sciences. Bachelor of Arts:

University-preparatory English is required and university-preparatory courses in math, humanities, social sciences and science are recommended.

Bachelor of Science:

University-preparatory English and university-preparatory math (pre-calculus) are required. University-preparatory

courses in math, humanities, social sciences and science are recommended.

Bachelor of Commerce:

University-preparatory English and university-preparatory math (pre-calculus) are required. University-preparatory courses in math, humanities, social sciences and science are recommended.

Bachelor of Fine Arts:

University-preparatory English is required and university-preparatory courses in math, humanities, social sciences and science are recommended. All Fine Arts applicants are required to present a portfolio of their previous artwork for assessment. Please visit mta.ca/faculty/arts-letters/finearts for more information.

Bachelor of Music:

University-preparatory English is required and university-preparatory courses in math, humanities, social sciences and science are recommended. All Music applicants must arrange an audition/interview and theory test. Please visit mta.ca/music for more information.

Undergraduate Admission Requirements

TRANSFER AND MATURE STUDENTS

Students pursuing post-secondary studies at an accredited university or college should present a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for consideration. If course work has been undertaken at more than one institution, official transcripts from each must be provided and will be taken into consideration. Once you've been offered admission, your completed courses will be assessed for transfer credits. Please consult the Academic Calendar for more information concerning admissions and transfer credit policies.

Individuals who are 22 years of age or older, and who have attempted fewer than 18 credits of transferable post-secondary level courses, may be eligible for admission as a mature student. Mature students should include an updated resumé, names and contact information for at least two references who can attest to your potential to succeed at university, letter of intent and all official high school/post-secondary transcripts with their application.

AMERICAN STUDENTS

American students are expected to complete a senior-level university preparatory English course and at least four other university-preparatory courses. Students interested in Science or Commerce should also complete a pre-calculus math or equivalent math course. SAT/ACT scores are not required, but students are encouraged to submit them if available. Applicants should feel free to contact the Admissions team for more information (admissions@mta.ca).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

As academic requirements vary by country, international students are encouraged to visit our website mta.ca/apply/whoareyou/internat.html or contact the admissions team for more information (admissions@mta.ca).

In general, applicants should have a strong academic record combined with a history of extracurricular and community involvement. If your first language is not English, please provide documentation to show that you meet our English language proficiency requirements. To be considered for our Entrance Scholarship program, proof must be received prior to the scholarship deadline of **March 15**. INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma students must have at least three higher level courses with a minimum score of four in each higher level and standard level subject undertaken with an overall score of 28 (excluding bonus points). IB diploma candidates may qualify for up to 30 transfer credits. Higher level courses with scores of 5 or higher will be assessed for transfer credits. If students complete three or more higher level courses with scores of 5 or higher, their standard level courses (with scores of 5 or higher) and Theory of Knowledge (with a minimum grade of B) will also be considered for transfer credit.

GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (GCE)

Your GCE must include two subjects at the Advanced Level and three at Ordinary Level, or three Advanced Level and one Ordinary Level, with an overall average of C and no subject below a D grade.

BACCALAUREATE

Students following France's system of education must complete the requirements for the Baccalaureate with a minimum academic standing of *Assez Bien*.

STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Students who have been identified as having a specific learning disability and who wish to receive assistance while attending Mount Allison should identify themselves in Section B, Question #6 on the Application Form. They will then be sent a Supplemental Application Form and will be asked to return it with documentation confirming their learning disability to the Meighan Centre. Please note that documentation should be no more than two years old. 1 Mount Allison Application for Admission

2 Official Academic Transcripts (High School, Post-Secondary, etc.)

3 \$60.00 (\$50.00 for online application) Non-Refundable Application Fee (certified cheque/money order payable to Mount Allison University.)

4 Bachelor of Fine Arts and Bachelor of Arts (Major in Fine Arts) Applicants must submit to the Fine Arts Department a portfolio of their work and the additional Art Information Sheet. Please visit mta.ca/faculty/arts-letters/finearts for application information and deadlines.

5 Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Arts (honours/major in Music) applicants must submit to the Music Department a Music Application Form. Please visit mta.ca/music for application information and deadlines.

6 Students with Learning Disabilities who will be seeking assistance from the Meighan Centre must submit a Supplemental Application Form for Students with Learning Disabilities, and supporting documents by September 1st.

7 International Students must submit documentation satisfying the English Language Proficiency Requirement.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

Mount Allison University offers one of the strongest and most competitive scholarship and bursary programs in Canada. With more than \$2,000,000 in scholarships, bursaries, and financial aid awarded each year, scholarships and bursaries are an ideal way to help off-set the cost of your post-secondary studies. In fact, in 2010 68% of our entering class received an entrance award and many benefitted from in-term, need-based financial aid bursaries.

GUARANTEED ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Students with a calculated average of 80% or higher on the university-preparatory courses considered for admission, and who have submitted all required documents by the scholarship deadline, will automatically be considered for an entrance scholarship starting at \$500/year. Beyond the guaranteed amount, any entrance scholarship has the potential to be increased up to \$5,000/ year based on extracurricular involvement, leadership potential, community service, letters of reference and work or internship experience. So don't be shy – let us know about all your achievements!

Your application for admission and official mid-year transcript must be received or postmarked by **March 15** at the latest to be considered for entrance scholarships. Students are encouraged to submit any supplemental items together in one package, and all supplemental information received by the deadline will be considered to determine a scholarship amount. Scholarship decisions are made by committee following decisions on admission and successful candidates will be informed of their award by letter.

BELL SCHOLARSHIPS

Mount Allison University's Bell Scholarships are among the largest undergraduate awards in Canada. The university offers six Bell Scholarships valued at \$12,000/year and five Bell Achievement Awards valued at \$9,000/year, all of which are renewable over four years.

A separate application is required for these awards and includes an essay, reference letters, and summary of your leadership, volunteer, extracurricular and work experience. Applications can be found online at mta.ca/apply/money_matters/bell.html

Your completed Bell Scholarship application should be submitted in one package, and **must be received or postmarked by March 15 at the latest for consideration**. Please ensure an application for admission and official grade 12 mid-year transcript has also been submitted prior to the deadline.
